Under the Treasurer's Report, Shelly Jasek reported \$50,766.01 in the checking account as of August 31, 2018. The current month actual income less expenses is \$1,609.34 and the year-to-date actual income less expenses is \$(6,533.52).

Committee Reports

Property – Paula Jenson reviewed the following items for the Council:

- Estimates to replace shrubs along the parking lot by the library and getting sprinklers turned on for that area are being looked at.
- Property Committee has appointed a kitchen remodeling committee to begin looking at remodeling possibilities in the kitchen. No bids will be obtained until the first of the year.
- The committee is working on lighting the front of the church.
- Carpeting the Fellowship Hall is pending.
- Some pews and areas around the altar have been repaired.

Nominating Committee

The nominating committee comprised of Paula Jenson, Sharon Gripp, Patti Hueston and one person to be named that is not on council, is being formed to fill two council vacancies

Old Business

- Blessing of the Animals – Originally scheduled for October 6, 2018, has been postponed until the spring due to a similar

event with the same date, and not currently having a pastor.

New Business

- Cory Stanford asked that the council consider allowing him to explore the idea of starting a couples' group. Council approved.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

Graceful Generosity

Make Your Choice

Joshua had faithfully served the nation Israel after the death of Moses. He was faithful both to his God and to his people. At the end of his life, as the nation is taking its place in the Promised Land, he offers them a choice:

"Now fear the Lord and serve him with all faithfulness... But if serving the Lord seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your forefathers served ... or the gods of the Amorites... But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord" (Joshua 24:14-15).

As Christian stewards, we, too, have a choice to make. Maybe we're not tempted to serve the gods of the Amorites, but there is another god that vies for our worship: the god of wealth. That god promises that, if we put our trust in him, he will make us powerful, envied by others, satisfied by all the possessions he can obtain for us, and bring us status and prestige among our peers. This god, of course, is just as false as the idol the Amorites worshiped. He may bring temporary good fortune, but we find no lasting value, only disappointment and disillusionment, in following him.

The Israelites' answer to Joshua was, *"We will serve the Lord"* (Joshua 24:21). Let us "serve the Lord" as he has enabled us to do.

The Garden

There once was a woman who longed to have a flower garden. Each year she would visit her neighbor, who had the most beautiful garden she had ever seen, and he would give her cuttings and seeds for her garden.

But when she would return home, she would change her mind at the last minute saying: "But my neighbor's garden is so much lovelier than anything I could hope to grow. And he knows so

much more about gardening ... I could never hope to grow a garden half so lovely as that. Why should I even try?"

One day her neighbor stopped by her home and saw that she had not one flower growing anywhere around her house.

"I've provided you with so much," he said, "and yet you have done nothing at all with what I have given you!"

And so it is with each of us. The Lord gives us talents and expects us to develop them. We cannot judge our worth by comparing ourselves to others but must bloom and grow the best we can with what we have been given.



On the Lighter Side

A well-worn one-dollar bill and a similarly distressed twenty-dollar bill arrived at a Federal Reserve Bank to be retired. As they moved along the conveyor belt to be burned, they struck up a conversation. The twenty-dollar bill reminisced about its travels all over the country. The one-dollar bill replied, “Oh I’ve been to the Methodist Church, the Baptist Church, the Lutheran Church...”

The twenty-dollar bill interrupted. “What’s a church?”

Christ’s Ambassadors

“...God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ ... has committed to us the message of reconciliation. We are therefore Christ’s ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us” (2 Corinthians 5:18-20).

Being an ambassador is a badge of honor and a great responsibility as well. Often the opinions held about a country are those formed by what is known about its ambassador. How critical, then, is our “ministry of reconciliation” (2 Corinthians 5:18). As ambassadors, we are not presenting ourselves; we are making Christ known.

The first sight of Christ that some may get is their view of Christ in us. We are called to let the light of his love, faith, and forgiveness shine in our lives that others might see and give glory to God (Matthew 5:16). As stewards of the Gospel, compelled by compassion for the lost, we desire to carry out our ministry of reconciliation. As ambassadors representing the one who has sent us, we declare to the world how God has reconciled us to himself through his Son. God makes his appeal to the unbeliever

through us, and, therefore, it is imperative that we, as stewards of the Gospel, which is the life-giving truth, preach and teach that word of God. We choose to be among those workers in the harvest field (Matthew 9:36-38) who share our testimonies of faith, always pointing others to Christ and his Gospel.

God Works through Us

J. Hudson Taylor wrote, “God’s work done in God’s way will never lack God’s supply.” The message from this statement is that God has given his people all the material and spiritual resources needed to accomplish his purposes. When we do God’s will, he will supply, through us, all the resources that are needed for his church (2 Corinthians 9:10-11). He wants us to be his channels through which the gifts needed for his work will flow. By God’s grace, we can be faithful stewards who willingly share our gifts for God’s work.
